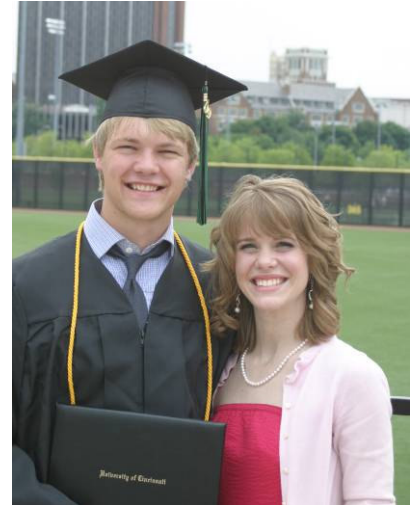
## Brian
